Together with the Site Directors, Lead Faculty and other Site Faculty, the Site Faculty for Curriculum form the "matrix" type of organization of the UBC Family Medicine Residency Program

Qualification:

- Membership in and certification by the College of Family Physicians of Canada
- Eligibility for licensure in B.C.
- Eligibility for faculty appointment (clinical or academic) in the UBC Department of Family Practice
- Educational and administrative experience is required
- Demonstrated passion and ability in teaching and working with residents

Responsibilities include:

- To be familiar with and conversant in:
 - o the accreditation standards of the:
 - CFPC "Red Book" (see CFPC accreditation webpage) and
 - Conjoint RCPSC-CFPC-CMQ General Standards of Accreditation (see CFPC Accreditation webpage)
 - the CFPC Triple-C Curriculum and the CanMEDs-FM roles (see CFPC website).
- Together with the Site Director, is responsible for:
 - o curriculum planning and implementation at the site
 - ensuring that the site curriculum meets the learning objectives set by the program as well as the accreditation guidelines of the College of Family Physicians of Canada
 - o the planning and implementation of an academic program for residents at the site, to be delivered during the academic time.
 - o on-going strategic planning of the curriculum
- Attendance at and participation in the monthly Site Education Committee meetings and other relevant functions as required.
- Regular communication with the Site Faculty for Assessment and Evaluation to ensure, along with the Site Director, that the "Learning Cycle" is optimized.
- Attendance at and participation in program-wide Curriculum Tele-/videoconferences and Retreats with a view to:
 - o sharing information and resources
 - reviewing, revising, and (re)writing objectives and other program-wide curriculum resources
 - o creating new program-wide resources
- Participation (maximum 8 hours per year) in the collaborative resident selection process both at the Program level and at the site level

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Remuneration:

• Time commitment and remuneration will be negotiated with the Site Director and/or Program Director. It is normally 0.1 FTE (0.5 days/week) for a site of 16-30 residents (total R1 & R2).

Reporting:

The Site Faculty is hired by the Site Director and reports to the Site Director and the Lead Faculty for Curriculum

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
