## PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS: 2023-2025

For successful completion of the Family Medicine Residency Program, the following criteria must be met:

1. Achievement of Family Medicine competencies in all the following Core Learning Outcomes and domains as evidenced by ITARS, reflections (3/year), periodic reviews (3/year), Video Reviews (4/year), Scholarship work, Field Notes, (and other documentation of daily performance) and SOO practices across all practice settings. ### Promotion to R2

The Site Level Competency Committee (SLCC) or equivalent, and the Site Director, will review R1 performance and evidence of acquisition of sufficient competence through field notes, other relevant documentation of daily performance, ITARs, periodic reviews, reflections,\* scholarship skills, and professional behaviour in all training contexts in determining readiness for R2 responsibilities. The SLCC will be guided by the UBC FP R1 to R2 Transition benchmark. Recommendation will be from the SLCC to the Site Director, and then to the Program Director.

### Program Completion\*\*

The Site Level Competency Committee or equivalent, and Site Director, will review R2 performance and evidence of acquisition of sufficient competence through field notes, other relevant documentation of daily performance, ITARs, periodic reviews, reflections\*, scholarship skills, and professional behaviour. Recommendation will be from the SLCC to the Site Director, and then to the Program Director.

The Program Director, based on the above process, will, at the appropriate interval:

- attest to the CFPC that the resident is a candidate for the certification examination,
- put forward to the appropriate Regulatory Authority for licensure, those who have successfully completed requirements for the Residency training program,
- attest to the CFPC that the resident has sufficient evidence for program completion and that they are competent to enter and adapt to the independent (i.e., unsupervised) practice of comprehensive family medicine anywhere in Canada.
